



How Indoor Centerfire 900 Awards are Determined

Summary

Awards will be determined and paid out for each match date. There is no league involved. There are no gun classes or NRA classifications involved.

50% of entry fees (less any match expenses) will be paid back to shooters as cash awards.

Only the Aggregate 900 scores will be used for award purposes.

A modified Lewis Classification System will be used to determine award winners.

Lewis Classes A, B, and C will be established, with awards going to 1st, 2nd and 3rd places within each Lewis Class, where warranted.

Determining Awards

Shooters from both relays on a given match date will compete for cash awards.

- Awards will be based on their Aggregate 900 scores. Scores will be ranked from highest to lowest. If needed, the tie-breaker will be the highest X-count.
- Using the ranked list of Aggregate 900 scores, the total number of shooters will be divided by three to establish Lewis Classes A, B, and C. Any remainder will go into Class C.
- Of the total entry fees taken in, 50% (less any match expenses) will go to the club as profit and 50% will go into the payout pot for awards. The total payout pot will then be split 40/30/30% to create payout pots for Lewis Classes A, B, and C.
- The top three shooters in each Lewis Class will receive cash awards using a 50/30/20% split of the money in their respective payout pot.

Details for Establishing Lewis Classes and Cash Awards

- If there are 1-5 shooters, only Lewis Class A will be established. The total payout amount will be 100% for Class A. The top 3 shooters in Class A will get cash awards using a 50/30/20% payout from the awards pot. If there are only 2

shooters in Class A, they will get awards using a 60/40% payout. If there is only one shooter in Class A, the shooter will get a 100% payout.

- If there 6-10 shooters, there will be 2 Lewis Classes. The total number of shooters will be divided by 2 to establish Lewis Classes A and B. Any remainder goes into Lewis Class B. The total payout amount will be split 60/40% among Classes A and B. The top 3 shooters in Classes A and B will get cash awards using a 50/30/20% payout from the award amounts allocated for Classes A and B.
- If there 11 or more shooters, there will be 3 Lewis Classes. The total number of shooters will be divided by 3 to establish Lewis Classes A, B, and C. Any remainder goes into Class C. The total payout amount will be split 40/30/30% among Classes A, B, and C. The top 3 shooters in Classes A, B, and C will get cash awards using a 50/30/20% payout from the award amounts allocated for Classes A, B, and C.
- Awards may be easily determined by using the Indoor Centerfire 900 Match Payout Table which has been pre-calculated based on the criteria spelled out above for establishing Lewis Classes and calculating Cash Awards and 50% payback of match entry fees for the total number of shooters.

Distribution of Awards

Awards will be handed out at the next scheduled match, if possible. Otherwise, they will be credited to a holding account for winners and paid out in cash the next time we see you.
