- Rain or shine, 60 covered firing points.
- All firing done at 25 yards.
- Police-L Targets.
- Lewis Classification Awards.
- Rim Fire: Sat. & Sun. 9:00 a.m.
- Center Fire (.32 cal. and or larger): Sat. & Sun. p.m.
- Rim Fire matches are shot first, starting at 9:00 a.m. with the first relay; two
 relays only. Two relays of Center Fire matches start after the lunch break.
 Competitors will fire all matches (Slow Fire, Police-L, Timed Fire, and Rapid
 Fire) before leaving the line. Each match is completed the day fired and
 awards will be made that day. Each relay takes about 1 hour & 20 minutes.
- The relay you are assigned will be the same relay for both days on a spaceavailable, first-come, first-served basis. If any positions are open on an earlier relay, you may consult the Stat House for reassignment - also on a first-come, first-served basis. (Note: There is no guarantee on which relay you will be assigned. No self-assigned firing positions are allowed either.)
- Shooters needing assistance will be accommodated.
- We have 2 levels of baffles on the range, so if you are tall, please indicate your height for proper placement on the line when registering.
- Shooters must supply their own hearing and eye protection, staple guns,

staples, and pens or pencils. Scoring overlays may be used.

- All guns must have an Empty Chamber Indicator (ECI) installed when being made safe. If you don't have one, an ECI will be provided.
- NO ALIBIS: The only exceptions are range alibis, or when a competitor has fired on an opponent's target. In this case, the cross-firing competitor will have the shots scored as misses, and the person having the excess shots may refire or take the ten lowest shots. DECISION OF THE MATCH OFFICIALS WILL BE FINAL.
- SCORING CHALLENGES: Any challenges to the scoring will cost \$2, and will be settled by a 3-Person Jury in the Stat House. If the challenge is upheld, the challenger gets the \$2 back. If not, the club gets the \$2.
- PRACTICE: The Bullseye range will be open for free practice on Friday, Sept. 20th, from 1:00 p.m. 3:00 p.m. Continuous Police-L matches (30 shot Police-L course 10 shots each of slow, timed, and rapid fire) will be run. Great way to get sighted in; and to get acclimated to the course of fire.

<u>Note</u>: If you need to practice, please take advantage of this free session on Friday. There will be no practice relays allowed during the matches on Saturday and Sunday.

• Breakfast and lunch will be available at the clubhouse both days.

Breakfast Saturday: 6:00 - 10:00 a.m.

Sunday: 7:00 - 10:00 a.m.

Lunch Both days: 11:00 a.m. - 1:30 p.m.
